

Intuition defined

 Using or based on what one feels to be true even without conscious reasoning; instinctive.

 Intuition is the ability to acquire knowledge without inference and/or the use of reason.

 Remnant of an ancient survival mechanism, as it allows us to sense danger without taking the time to analyze a situation.



Intuition defined

 The reliability of one's intuition depends greatly on past knowledge and occurrences in a specific area.





Intuitive defined in Management Theory

- Carl Jung (1921) describe intuition as:
 - "perception via the unconscious": using senseperception only as a starting point, to bring forth ideas, images, possibilities, ways out of a blocked situation, by a process that is mostly unconscious.
- Gary Klein (decision making)
 - Found that under time pressure, high stakes, and changing parameters, experts used their base of experience to identify similar situations and intuitively choose feasible solutions.

Intuitive thinking for a PM

- Have a good sense on what is about to happen next
- Open to new ways of doing things
- Forecasts for future risks

- Evaluating people, situations and responses

Intuitive thinking for the PM

- Change our perspective on intuition
- Allow yourself to act
- Acknowledge that everyone uses it
- The "M" word = alpha-state brainwaves
- Head vs Heart challenge
- Listen to the small voice

 - Remove any past or future concerns for a few minutes, and let yourself simply experience what is directly in front of, and around, you. Don't judge or comment, just notice




